## Hobart Greens' Housing and Homelessness statement

Hobart: Everybody's Home Tackling Housing and Homelessness in Hobart

"Our community prides itself on caring for each other. Yet we are being tested currently: people in Hobart are struggling to find accommodation to rent or buy. This in turn creates a lack of diversity all cities desperately need.

Housing is a fundamental human right. Too many of our community are falling through the cracks. Current problems include whole houses being converted from long-term to short stay accommodation, tax breaks giving an unfair advantage to investors, properties left vacant, and land in residential areas not being used to increase housing supply.

The Greens are working at all levels of government to advocate for homes for our community. At Town Hall, we have been working hard to stop short stay accommodation from eroding housing supply.

There is more to do, so that everyone in Hobart does have a home."

Homelessness can happen to anyone, at any time. Women aged over 55 are the fastest-growing group of homeless Australians (ABS 2011 vs ABS 2016)

"Selling my home in my 70's I had insufficient funds to buy outright, so had to rent. The housing crisis was looming in Hobart. Nine months into my first rental, the owner wanted to spend 6 months a year in the unit himself and rent it out to holiday-makers for six months. When house-hunting, as many as 50 other people were also trying to find an affordable home. Many properties were in very poor condition but still too expensive. The cost of this housing crisis, financially and emotionally, is something that lingers on the fringes of my life even though I now have a secure and comfortable home with kind and supportive landlords." Nearly 60% of homeless people in Australia are aged under 35 years (ABS 2016). Here's what Greens candidate for Councillor, Nathan Volf has to say:

"As a social worker, I have seen far too many stay in homes that are unsafe. Young people will often fall out of education, develop mental health complications or experience tremendous trauma during this time. As a mental health professional who has witnessed it time and time again, it is clear to me how much homelessness can affect the health - physical and mental - of individuals who experience it".
